The charity runs the largest mentoring programme in the country. Volunteer Mentors offer their knowledge and experience to help clients achieve their career goals.

Chair's Report



Sarah Finnegan-Dehn, Chair

Having been a trustee for PRIME Cymru for six years I am delighted to be writing my first report as Chair of this great charity. PRIME Cymru provides personalised one-to-one support to people over the age of 50 who are looking to embark upon a new phase in their career journey. The fact is that the idea of a career for life is no longer a realistic concept for anyone. However, the challenges for older people who find themselves looking for a new start are even greater.

In October 2023, the Older Persons Commissioner in Wales reported that levels of employment of older people in Wales are low compared to other parts of the UK. By helping individuals back into the labour market, we are also supporting the economy in Wales. The latest figures show that 791,200 people aged over 50 are economically inactive in Wales, of these 191,500 are aged between 50 and 64, and we know there are many people beyond this age that still want or need to remain in work. With support, they can rejoin the labour market.

PRIME Cymru knows that older people have a huge amount to offer. They represent a vast resource of untapped talent and have valuable transferable skills, experience and a wealth of knowledge. With some employment sectors experiencing staff shortages PRIME Cymru wants to encourage employers to have a more positive approach to employing older people. We want a greater number of organisations in Wales to have an open and welcoming culture in relation to older workers.

We have been working in the past year to deliver our strategic plan. This includes developing a sound financial base for the future, increasing people's awareness of our charity in Wales and developing our work around equity, diversity and inclusion.

As is the case across the charity sector we have also been feeling the impact of Brexit in terms of funding. We are therefore very grateful to our current funders, and particularly the Moondance Foundation for their support.

I would like to thank the staff and the Chief Executive for working so hard to support our clients. They are a fantastic team who are enthusiastic, committed and willing to go that extra mile. I look forward to working closely with them and with the existing and newly appointed trustees during the coming year.

From the Chief Executive

I would like to offer all those who have continued to support us, and those who have joined us as new supporters in the last year, a heartfelt thank you for enabling us to continue our vital, often life-changing, work across Wales. PRIME

Cymru is a relatively small charity with a low-cost base that has a high impact. In a year where we saw great changes and reductions to the funding of the third sector in Wales we have managed to work with our funders and sponsors to maintain a pan Wales service going forward.

Thanks to your generous donations of time and money we have been able to work on a one-to-one longer-term basis with nearly 1,000 mature individuals in Wales who needed support to return to economic activity or move closer to the world of work. In fact, 89% of the people we have worked with achieved positive outcomes. Through this work we have made a significant contribution to the economy in Wales to a level of £2 million social return on investment. You can see some examples of our work in this annual report which we hope provides you with a taste of what we do. There are more examples on our website, and you can follow us on social media too.

During the year we saw the sad passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, and His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales ascend to the Throne. We are delighted that His Majesty King Charles III has agreed to remain as our royal founding patron and continue to provide his support to the charity he founded back in 2001.

Also during the year, after a six-year tenure as Chair of PRIME Cymru, Andrew Morgan stood down. His support and guidance over this time has been invaluable both to the charity and to me personally. Much gratitude is offered to him for giving of his time so generously and selflessly.

I would also like to welcome Sarah Finnegan-Dehn as our new Chair who took up the role in December 2023. Sarah has immense experience in this sector and has already provided great support since joining us as a Trustee some six years ago – I look forward to working closely with her during her tenure.

Over the last couple of years, we have worked hard to gain accreditation for the quality of our service via the Quality Mark, and we have also gained the Investors in Volunteering accreditation. Over the next year we intend to work towards recognition of our green credentials by gaining the Green Mark showing our commitment to a more environmentally friendly future.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank my senior management team and all the staff who have shown such unwavering commitment to our clients over the last year, and also to our Board of Trustees who share with us their skills and experience to drive forward our future plans.

PRIME Cymru is Wales's only charity supporting those over the age of 50 back into work – we're here because of you. We couldn't continue our life-changing work without you. Please keep working with us, and together we will make it work for people over 50 in Wales.

Nicola Jones, Abergavenny

Nicola was supported by a PRIME Cymru to set up her therapy business, Pachamama Wellbeing.

Nicola Jones, aged 56, found herself looking to make a career change due to the uncertainty of COVID. She wanted to branch out to something new, whilst making the most of her skillset.

With guidance from Volunteer Mentor, Julie Goodfellow, Nicola successfully combined her background in therapy with her hobby - keeping alpacas.



Mae PRIME Cymru'n cynnig cymorth un-i-un wedi'i deilwrio i bobl dros 50 oed sy'n chwilio am agoriad gyrfa newydd. Y gwir yw nad yw'r syniad o yrfa am oes yn realistig i neb erbyn hyn. Fodd bynnag, mae'r heriau i bobl hŷn sy'n canfod eu hunain yn chwilio am gychwyn newydd yn fwy nag erioed.
